As your police chief there are things that could come up in a background check that the SB may want to consider before hiring. OA agree with Chief – background check for everyone. If does not negatively impact ... but Chief says we should be more clear on our policy

Chief cannot do background check. Fingerprint card just means doing latent finger prints – but not part of criminal request. Along with motor vehicle record (SR22 -habitual offender).

Chief: Is the background going to be a blanket policy with all new employees? \$25
